

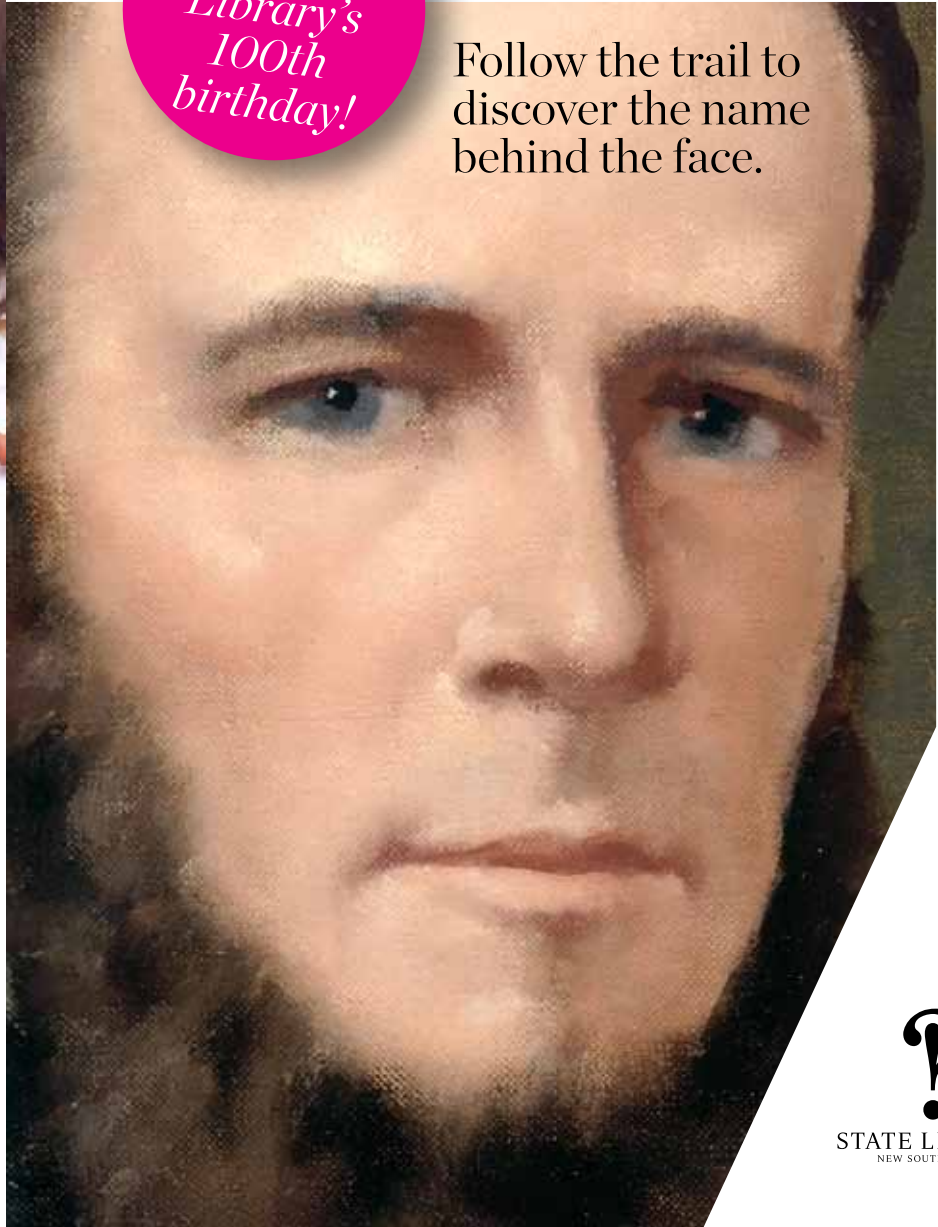

Walk past the people studying at the tables and head for the Mitchell Library.

Clue 3

Can you find the letter made from convict leg irons and a naval officer with a very long name?

Clue 4

Listen carefully. Can you hear birds? Henry Grace made whistles to MITATE bird song

Clue 5

The ALGETY walkway links the State Reference Library to the Mitchell Library

Clue 6

If you make too much noise in here someone will say HHHHH

Clue 7

A HAIR he liked to sit in when he was reading

Clue 8

A small collection of BOKS from Mr Mitchell's extraordinary collection

Climb up the marble stairs and go into the *ONE hundred* exhibition.

Walk down the stairs and find the alphabet wall. Each letter is made up from items in the Library's amazing collections.

Which letter features Dr Lang's church and a Tongan drum?

Clue 1

Look up at the banner, can you find the letter which has a dancer with long curly hair?

Clue 9

Can you find a big banner hanging on the wall? What vehicle is in the centre? RAIN

Clue 10

Can you find two small leaves? Leaves like these were used to make a cup of EA

Start in the Macquarie St foyer and collect the letters to spell Mr Mitchell's full name.
